

February program to feature the Mars 2020 mission, set to land on Mars this month

NCRAL convention canceled, January General Meeting report

The NCRAL 2021 convention, scheduled for May 7-8 at St. Norbert College, has been canceled this year, says convention chair Gerry Kocken. It marked the second consecutive cancellation of the conference due to the COVID pandemic. Kocken, of the Neville Public Museum Astronomical Society (this year's host club), made the decision in conjunction with the NPMAS board and officials at St. Norbert College.

January General Meeting notes

The first NCSF General Meeting of this year was again held via Zoom on Jan. 7.

Many members discussed their observations of the Jupiter-Saturn conjunction, which was best viewed in the last half of December. While the day of closest approach (December 21) was completely overcast in southeast Wisconsin, members did have a chance to see the planets on nights a few days before and after. Though not as close as on December 21, most had the pleasure of seeing and/or photographing both gas giants in a single telescope field. Treasurer Gene DuPree reported

\$11,787.17 in the club's account. President Jeff Setzer reminded everyone that the observatory at Harrington Beach State Park remains closed for observing and public events, but members are permitted to enter the building periodically to check on its condition.

The park is open to the public, but an annual vehicle sticker is required to enter. The fee is \$28. You can purchase stickers online at <u>https://yourpassnow.com/ParkPass/wi</u> or by phone at 1-888-305-0398. If you are 65 or older, admission stickers are just \$13.
